

DIGITALIZATION OF MUSICAL CULTURAL HERITAGE IN THE SYSTEM OF ART EDUCATION

DIGITALIZAREA PATRIMONIULUI MUZICAL ÎN SISTEMUL EDUCAȚIEI ARTISTICE

Articolul examinează problema digitalizării patrimoniului cultural muzical în sistemul educației artistice ca un factor important pentru conservarea și promovarea tradițiilor muzicale naționale. Este analizat rolul tehnologiilor digitale moderne în procesul de conservare a arhivelor muzicale, a materialelor de partituri, precum și a înregistrărilor audio și video. These authors analyze modern digital tools, online platforms, and resources that enable the effective preservation, reproduction, and presentation of educational materials and cultural heritage. At the same time, the issue of digitalizing musical cultural heritage within the educational process requires further scientific investigation [1, 5, 6].

The purpose of the study is to analyze the role of digital technologies in the preservation of musical cultural heritage and their application within the educational process of arts institutions.
